Quail's Nest Clubhouse Hours: Members must sign-in on arrival (no later than 3 PM). Wing Pointe Members have key access.

Wing Pointe Sporting Clays Club Rules



Use of the Club by Members and their immediate family, and Guests

Only Members in Good Standing, their immediate family and their invited guests are permitted to use the facilities of WP. A Member is considered to be in Good Standing when current with his or her Dues payment and other financial responsibilities, has a signed Liability and Save Harmless Agreement (Members Release) for the current season on file at the Club and his or her membership privileges have not been suspended by the Board. Members are responsible for their guests' behavior.

There are two Liability Release and Save Harmless Agreements:

- Member and Immediate Family Release (included in annual dues mailing)
- Guest Release

No Member will be allowed into the fields at WP before having signed a Member Release.

Each guest must have a signed Release agreement for each visit date. Contact the Club Manager in advance to coordinate access to the proper release.

For safety reasons ALL Members and Guests must sign in with the Club Manager/Staff BEFORE being permitted on WP property to hunt , or any other activity. This includes Deer hunters who must notify the Club Manager/Staff in advance of going deer hunting, i.e., phone, email or text.

All guests **MUST BE ACCOMPANIED BY THE MEMBER IN THE FIELD** or otherwise on WP property, AT ALL TIMES. No exceptions. Park all vehicles in the designated parking areas.

Club Dues

Dues Payments must be accompanied by the signed Members Release for your account to be considered current and in Good Standing. Members will be billed around May 15th with payment due by June 15th. Late payment fees will be assessed for any payments not received by the Assistant Treasurer by June 15th. If dues, all late payments, and a Members Release, are not received by August 31st, the delinquent Member will be automatically dropped from membership.

Safety Rules for All Club Shooting Events

Eye & ear protection are required at all times. If you experience a misfire, keep the barrel pointed in a safe direction and wait 60 seconds before opening a breach type gun or cycling the action on an automatic or pump action gun. If your firearm has a primer only discharge and the wad has not cleared the barrel DO NOT attempt to reload or fire another round.

IN BOTH ABOVE CASES CALL THE WP MANAGER OR THE WP SHOOT SUPERVISOR/STAFF MEMBER IMMEDIATELY FOR ASSISTANCE TO ENSURE YOUR FIREARM IS CLEARED AND PLACED BACK INTO SAFE OPERATION.

Members holding private shoots may opt to fill vacancies by requesting a blast email be sent to the general membership. Please be advised WP members are responsible for the conduct of their guests.

General Hunting Safety Rules



The proper blaze orange clothing will be worn whenever in the field during hunting season. In addition to the 200 square inch minimum blaze orange PA state requirement, a blaze orange hunting cap must also be worn while field hunting. WP has the following additional blaze orange requirements:

Hunters must wear a cap made of daylight fluorescent orange and an outer garment containing at least 200 square inches of fluorescent orange material above the waist visible from all sides, at all times, when in the field or engaged in hunting during the bird hunting season. This applies to all persons in a hunting party. Fox and coyote hunting are permitted by **active members only following State regulations.**

All guns must be unloaded in the Clubhouse parking lot, within marked safety zones, and within 150 feet of a building. A broken gun with live shells in the chamber is not an unloaded gun. Neither firearms nor dogs are permitted in the Clubhouse.

For Upland Bird Hunting

- No shot larger than #6 may be used in the field for all gauges.
- For 12ga, no shells larger than 2 3/4 inch shall be used as well as no “high brass”/high velocity loads.
- For 20ga, 28ga, and 410ga, 3 inch shells may be used.

Alcoholic Beverages or any other impaling substances Reminder - The consumption of alcoholic beverages or use of any impairing substance before or during any shooting activity by the person shooting or anyone involved in the shooting activity is forbidden. Anyone who consumes alcoholic beverages or is under the influence of any impairing substance will not be allowed back into the field. Alcoholic beverages are allowed ONLY after all shooting is completed. This rule applies especially during prepaid and larger private shoots where increased numbers of guests are likely, and a lunch is served between activities. Members are entirely responsible for their guests' conduct.

The following rules are for your benefit and safety. You and your guest must abide by them.

- A. Know the mechanical and firing characteristics of the firearm you use.
- B. Always keep the muzzle pointed in a safe direction.
- C. Unload firearm when not in use.
- D. Be sure that the barrel is clear of obstruction before using.
- E. Wear shooting glasses and hearing protection when in the field.
- F. Never climb a tree or cross a fence with a loaded gun.
- G. Do not shoot at hard surfaces or water.
- H. Never transport a loaded firearm in a vehicle.
- I. The maximum number of guns in a hunting party is limited 6 max in a squad (PA Game Commission Rules).
- J. The maximum number of persons in a hunting party is limited to 6.



Field Etiquette



Private hunts will be posted at the Clubhouse. Do not hunt or cross the indicated areas during the posted hours of the hunt. Members should notify the manager at least 24 hours in advance to request a field for a private hunt.

When done, the member is to return to the Clubhouse and report what was harvested and that the member is finished with the prepaid shoot. The Member may then hunt elsewhere and pay for what he harvests.

Never intentionally cross the forward path of another hunting party. Circle behind or wait for the individual or party to pass. This can be an issue when returning to the Clubhouse on a busy day.

Please make a special effort to pick up all your spent shells and any other shells or wads you encounter afield. This enhances our surroundings, and we all benefit from your example.

Follow all PA State and Federal Game Laws. We have no exemptions except for hunting dates, limits and sex for game birds that are stocked.

In the parking lot and in the vicinity of the Clubhouse, all dogs must be on a lead, tied to one of the posts at the edge of the parking lot, or contained in a dog carrier or in your vehicle.

While in the field, all dogs must remain under control and within a reasonable distance of its owner. Dogs **MUST** remain in the field being hunted and shall not encroach upon adjacent fields or hunters and run out of control causing birds to flush out of shot range. If the owner is not present "Lost" dogs such as this should be leashed if possible and a staff member contacted to retrieve and be held in the kennel for the owner to immediately collect. If a member requires assistance to develop a closer working dog the Club Manager or a member of the shooting committee will be available to make a referral. Violations will be addressed via a verbal discussion with a member of the shooting committee. Repeated violations will be addressed under the Disciplinary Procedures herein.

Club Etiquette



Dog Wash Station: If you use the spray nozzle, disconnect it from the hose, place it on the rail of the wash station, and let the hose drop to the ground so that the water drains out and doesn't freeze in the hose. Put the lid on the soap bottle and stand it upright and remember to remove the double-end snap-clip from your dog's collar.

Guest Policies



Members are permitted to bring guests for field bird hunting and will pay a fee of \$25 per visit day, per guest*. Guests under the age of 18 will not be charged the guest fee.

**Individual guests are permitted a maximum of 5 hunts at Wing Pointe per year.*

All guests must sign the appropriate Release, see Use of the Club by Members and their immediate family and Guests section in this Handbook.

Club Boundaries



Refer to the map posted in the Clubhouse and speak with the staff for specific field boundaries. Keep in mind our safety zones and legal distance from structure requirements. If you are uncertain, ask the Manager to review the boundaries before you go afield.

Private/ Prepaid Shoots | Social Functions

For your convenience and to minimize administrative efforts, all social functions and reserved shoots will be charged to your credit card or debited from your house account at the time of your reservation. This will be non-cancellable and nonrefundable within 7 days of the event. Please have your credit card number on file with the Club Manager or an established house account to facilitate the reservation process. All individual, group, and private shoots must be arranged with the manager in advance. Prior commitments and availability of birds can affect your plans, so please make arrangements as early as possible.

Stocking Practices and Hunting Zones

Stocking is contingent upon activity, weather, and bird availability. The objective is to provide shooting opportunities for the Members when at the club. Hunting zones may be assigned by the Manager as the manager interprets the hunting pressure.

Picnicking and Camping

Picnicking is permitted at the Ponds during the off (non-hunting) season for Members, their spouse and children/legal dependents living at home, age 18 through 24, and their guests who have signed the appropriate Release. Members may host a business or social picnic at the Ponds and/or the Clubhouse, making arrangements through the Club Manager. There is \$250 fee for such a group picnic.

Camping is permitted at Pond field. Please coordinate camping with the club manager.


